### **President's Corner**

## Fall is GREAT for Flying!

Fall general aviation flying offers beautiful scenery for trips to see foliage, but pilots must prioritize safety due to shorter days, potential early morning fog, frost, and icing. Additionally, be aware of increased bird activity and migration.

Here are 3 simple reminders for a safe fall flying season.

#### #1: Don't Skimp on the Preflight

You've probably heard the saying: Preflight like your life depends on it, because it does!

Visually inspect your propeller blades, spinner, and hub assembly. Look for any dents, nicks, gouges, cracks, missing hardware, and signs of corrosion, erosion, or oil leakage.

Next, carefully run your fingers over the blades, especially along the leading edge, to check for imperfections.

## #2: Know When to Preheat Your Aircraft Engine

That chill in the air means it's time to start thinking about preheating your aircraft engine — not only to ensure smoother, safer takeoffs but also to protect the life of your engine.

When is it cold enough to begin preheating your aircraft engine? Generally speaking, preheating is recommended for aircraft engines that have been cold-soaked to a temperature of freezing or below, but you should always check your engine manufacturer's recommendations.

#### #3: Plan for Reduced Daylight Hours

Last but not least, the changing seasons mean pilots need to be aware of reduced daylight hours and plan accordingly. As a reminder, the clocks will fall back on November 5, 2023, and the sun will set earlier in the evening.
